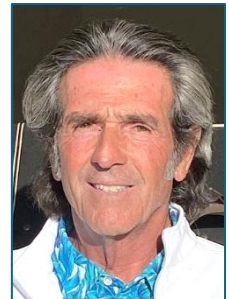
Barbara Birdsey, President
